Statement on President Trump's announcement on Jerusalem

We, the people of Tucson and Southern Arizona, strongly oppose the Trump Administration's recognition of Jerusalem as the capital of Israel and the plan to move the US embassy to Jerusalem. This action by President Trump signals total disregard of international law and the global consensus which consider east Jerusalem occupied Palestinian land.

And, the most dangerous consequence of this move, it will legitimize Israel's brutal military occupation and will negatively affect our vital interests in the Middle East and worldwide. Furthermore, it will undermine all efforts to help bring about a peaceful resolution to the conflict and has been condemned by governments and communities all over the world.
